Approved Minutes

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 3:01 p.m.

Members Present:

Guests Present: Carlos Diaz, Tina McClurkin, David Soto, and Marcela Valle.

Reading and Approval of Minutes: It was moved by **Khanh Ninh** and seconded by **Kenneth Yu** to approve the Minutes of the October 12, 2021, meeting. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

Report of Curriculum Chair: The Chair informed the Committee that she would gather more information and clarification regarding Independent Study. She would like the Committee to work on a formal process for piloting programs, courses, and software. She also mentioned she would be assembling a small group to outline and review the current Program Review process since the 6-year review focuses on specific items. In addition, there is still a need for an additional DCCC representative. The Curricunet Guide is currently being updated, and she thanked **Shelia Moore-Farmer** for her support and guidance. She anticipates the guide will be completed by the end of the year. The Chair spoke briefly about the NOCE Technology Committee. She shared concerns about the approval of classroom software and instructional tools. She believes the approval should resonate within the Committee and not elsewhere. She also shared that **Amabel Arredondo** is working on getting DE Addendum accessible through a link at the bottom of the COR page and hopes it is finalized by the end of the year. There was discussion on a time frame, and firm guidelines regarding resources in the curriculum as many of them are outdated. The Chair informed the Committee that the current list of course deactivations did not go through the formal review process in Curricunet. Moving forward, faculty will need to pre-launch each course deactivation in

Curricunet. Top Codes and SAM Codes were added to the agenda due to coding challenges associated with vocational and non-vocational courses. There are times when coding changes are needed after a course has been approved by the Curriculum Committee and the Chair proposed using a small group of committee members to review and approve those changes. **Tina McClurkin** asked to be notified of coding updates to courses since the changes affect Elumen. The Chair also informed the Committee that the website is currently being developed and that the WASC Curriculum Committee might be sharing items at the next Curriculum Committee meeting to receive input. The Chair concluded her report by asking the Committee what they hope to focus on and accomplish for the rest of the year and that the conversation will take place during the Discussion portion of the agenda.

Janet Cagley, DE Coordinator, reported on the 2022-2024 NOCE Distance Educational Plan draft. She informed the Committee that the draft outlines the apps already adopted. Steps for Vetting and Adopting Applications and Software approval were reviewed. She mentioned the importance of having software and applications meet instructional needs and integrating them with IT support and maintenance. Janet said she would like a listing of all adopted software/ apps used in courses. She also mentioned having the VPAT link and the privacy statement on the NOCE website for transparency purposes. App & Software Rubric presented to the DE Advisory group was reviewed. Credit was given to CSU East Bay Tech for much of the App & Software Rubric development.

David Soto spoke about district support on implementing and selecting software and programs. He also mentioned that the Technology Implementation Committee and the **DTC** could be reached for support. The Chair recommended that faculty submit a technology list on what is currently being used and/ or what might be anticipated for future use. This early submission will expedite the approval process once the curriculum is submitted for review since the software will have already been reviewed and appropriately implemented. **Janet Cagley** noted that the State Chancellor's Office currently does not have a list of accessible software as it is the institution's responsibility to ensure apps and software are accessible.

Old Business

- Course Updates- The Chair reported to the committee that all ESL for the Arts courses would not be moving forward. Once revisions are made, the courses will be brought back for review.

Discussion- The Chair asked the Committee to choose two items to accomplish together. **Khanh Ninh** suggested assisting with WASC Accreditation and course coding. **Karen Bautista** suggested having training, speakers, and course coding training. **Raine Hambly** agreed on prioritizing coding. She also suggested focusing on Credit for Prior Learning (CPL) and developing a policy.

David Soto shared that North Orange Continuing Education (NOCE), at times, is referred to as School of Continuing Education (SCE) on Administrative and Board policy language and recommended mentioning the discrepancy to committee chairs, so there is accurate representation throughout the district. He also suggested that the Committee adopt and streamline curriculum policies to be built into DegreeWorks, bringing the school closer to auto awarding.

The chair acknowledged **Marcela Valle** for helping with identifying courses, deactivations, and their impacts.

Alli Stanojkovic commented that she hopes to continue the Committee's work on growing distance education courses and is eager for the Committee to continue to work on making procedures more efficient and effective.

Karen Bautista praised the Committee for their hard work and said they should celebrate what has been accomplished throughout the year.

The Chair reminded the committee to attend the ASCCC training. To be more resourceful, **Janet Cagley** mentioned that questions should be sent ahead of time.
