We are committed to rebuilding the lives of the hungry and homeless through emergency food, resource distribution, emergency and rapid re-housing, eviction prevention and other initiatives designed to help people in need. Pathways of Hope offers programming under three strategic areas:

- **Prevention and Outreach:** Food and basic needs supply distribution, delivering meals to homebound clients, emergency utility/rental assistance, outreach resources and service navigation
- **Shelter and Housing:** Two shelters in our On-campus Housing Program, rapid re-housing program and permanent supportive housing.
- Advocacy and Collaboration: Over 40 local congregations and community agencies partner with us in helping address poverty, hunger, and homelessness.
