



Learning Options - Types of Classes

Zoom Courses scheduled at specific days/times (synchronous).

Mostly meet in Zoom through Canvas.

Online Completely online classes done on your own (asynchronous)

in Canvas or a combination of asynchronous work and required synchronous sessions on specific day/times. Optional meeting

times may be listed in the class notes.

Hybrid Classes that have online coursework in Canvas and in-person

classes on specific days/times. Students must attend both.

Face-to-Face Classes that are completely in-person and scheduled on campus

at specific days/times.





Student Success Spotlight: Regina Alcala



Alumna, NOCE High School Diploma and Rising Scholars Program

Regina Alcala has had her share of hard times. With addiction, homelessness, and incarceration in her past, Alcala felt unsure about her future. But then Alcala discovered North Orange Continuing Education (NOCE) and enrolled in the High School Diploma Program. "Going to school allowed me to build confidence in myself," proclaims Alcala. She was an active member of the NOCE Rising Scholars Program, which builds educational, transitional, and career pathways for formerly incarcerated and system-impacted individuals. Alcala graduated with her diploma in May 2023 and transitioned to Cypress College, where she is currently majoring in psychology. Alcala shared, "Today, I know that I am capable and more determined than ever to succeed." In addition to her academic pursuits, Alcala is now a staff member at NOCE for the Rising Scholars Program, as well as Co-President of the FITE (Formerly Incarcerated To Empowerment) Club and student advisor for the Rising Scholars Program at Cypress College.
